C-1	2-4 5-11	Mr. and Mrs. James R. Jones in front of their modest home here in Granite Quarry, N.C. Various shots of Grand Dragon of the KKK in North Carolina Mr. James R. Jones.
C-2	1-5 6-12 13-33	Young Negroes with white man in Klan area filling station near Farmville, N.C. The white man probably is a Klansman but he would not tell or give his name. Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford in his car. Note pistol and belt of ammunition on the console beside his drivers' seat; in some shots he is on short wave citizens' band radio. Door just behind him has a rifle with <del>box</del> telescopic sight and is mounted to side of door (see other pix for this shot). Extreme wide angle shots of a fantastic debate between Negro civil righters and Raymond Cranford of the Klan. The left to right in frame #33 (from this one which includes everyone you can determine the ID of the other shots) are clockwise: Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford (in light sweater and back to camera; Dr. Andrew Best (MD); Stewart Alsop; Cordell Kennedy of the Southern Christian Leadership Confr.; Tommy Bond also of the So. Chr. Leadr. Confr.; and Gratz Norcott, local undertaker and leader in the local NAACP. Ayden, N.C.
C-3	1-5 6a-10a 11a-13a 14a-18a 20a-25	Situation is same as described in C-2 (13-33) but single shot of Cordell Kennedy of the So. Christian Leadership Confr.; Local undertaker and NAACP Leader Gratz Norcott. Cordell Kennedy of the So. Christian Leadership confr. Local undertaker and NAACP Leader Gratz Norcott. Dr. Andrew Best (MD).
C-4	1-8 8a-9a 10a-15a 18a-23	Inside a part of the Klavern Hall of the Knights of the KKK at Farmville, N.C., is Sonny Fisher with coffin in what is called the outer dea. Exterior of what used to be an old Negro school but is now the Klavern Hall of the Knights of the KKK at Farmville. Grand Dragon of the United Klans of America in North Carolina James R. Jones with his wife in front of Cadillac given to him by the state's Klansmen and in front of his very modest home at Granite Quarry, N.C. Inside the modest home of Grand Dragon James R. Jones--this is the living room. Left to right: Grand Dragon James R. Jones; Col. of the Security Guard Grady Mars (he killed himself the next day) and Pete Young of a Raleigh TV station.
C-5	1-11 14	Vann Ray Cranford (9) is playing record entitled "Move Those Niggers North". This is in the home of the Exalted Cyclops. In some frames a second little kid is Forst Lanier Littleton (15 mos), the son of another Exalted Cyclops from near by Ayden, N.C. This is the Cranford residence which is near Farmville, N.C. <del>12</del> In the Cranford living room: Left to right: Stewart Alsop (hand to head); Pete Young (standing in background) Ted Ellsworth and Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford.

	31-36	Dressed up in his KKK outfit is Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford who is showing it to Stewart Alsop in most frames and Alsop and his aide Ted Ellsworth in frames 32 & 33.
C-6	3-6 7-12 14-37	This is Harry Richards of Harry's restaurant at Snow Hill, N.C. He runs the best restaurant in the area and refuses to serv <del>e</del> Negroes. Negro children picketing Piggly Wiggly super market in Ayden. Studies of Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford.
C-7	1-16  17a-24  24-25 26-28 29-36	Various shots of Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford (in KKK outfit) and Bennie Earl Oakes (in KKK security guard outfit) on the porch at the Cranford home and with a bunch of toys the local Klavern intended to hand out to underprivileged children for Xmas. Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford in his KKK dress and KKK Security Guard Bennie Earl Oakes in his guard outfit. EC Cranford in his outfit. Bennie Earl Oakes in his security guard outfit. Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford and 58-years-old Negro Cliff Harper, a family retainer for 35 years. "I'll kill anyone messing with him," said Cranford.
C-8	1-6 7-13	This is Klansman James Huey "Sonny" Fisher having breakfast with Stewart Alsop and party in Farmville, N.C. This is Klansman James Huey (Sonny) Fisher on the sidewalk in downtown Farmville, N.C.
C-9	1-3 4-5 6a-9 10-11 13-15 16-18 19-28 30-31 32	Ted Ellsworth dressed in KKK outfit with Raymond Cranford in shirt and tie and Stew Alsop seated in frame #3. Ellsworth was just horsing it up. Interior showing the alter of Klavern unit #161 at Ormandsville, N.C. Alsop, Ellsworth and Cranford are in background. Time exposures of the same room as in 4-5 showing cross lighted. Exalted Cyclops Raymond Cranford in Klavern #161 with Klavern mottos on signs hanging on wall in background. Exalted Cyclops Cranford demonstrates some of his judo technique for Alsop and Ellsworth inside Klavern #161. General view of the bleakness of Klavern 161--Cranford, Alsop, etc., in backgrnd.
