

- ACADEMIC BUILDING MA -

This building is the first half of College II with the second part to follow within two years. Academic IIA is a four story 110,000 square foot concrete frame building with brick exterior. It will house twenty eight classrooms and ten laboratories plus necessary academic offices for faculty, department chiefs and the Dean of College II. It will handle about 1500 students. The target date of December 1974 would permit opening for the Spring Term 1975 which will be a major breakthrough in academic space availability, and will relieve the very tight scheduling of classes.

- UBRARY II

really the start of a six wing-five story expansion. This wing of 60,000 square feet will consist of a rectangular core for stacks of 125,000 volumes surrounded by reading and research rooms for 500 persons. The next five wings will follow at two year intervals to keep up with the growth of the University. The connecting area between this new wing and the existing library will be used for administrative purposes by the librarians, and will also house an audio-visual center.
